


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YEAR 11 PROM

Even More Maths Challenge Success!

Following on from our other successes in this year's Maths Challenges, we were delighted to celebrate further achievements.

Five Year 11 students entered the Kangaroo Maths Challenge, which they were able to do after performing so well in the Intermediate Challenge. Thomas Walls achieved a further Gold certificate to add to his earlier Gold, with Aran Roberts achieving a Silver.

180 students across Years 7 and 8 participated in the Junior Maths Challenge. Every student who participated were able to successfully answer many problems correctly, with 69 students achieving either a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate. 6 students achieved a Gold: Willem Hughes (Year 7 and best in school!), Stanley Marks, Raffy Holloway, James Marchant, Reece Bower and Ethan Hall. All 6 students will be entered for the follow on challenge as a result of doing so well here.
