Their first big event is Lubenham Scarecrow Festival (9th and 10th September). At this event they will be having a book stall, a normal tombola and a bottle/can tombola. To help with this, they are looking for donations of new/used books, tombola prizes and bottles of wine/prosecco.

Over the Summer I have started an initiative called the Welland Eco Wardrobe. I am trying to gather together a collection of dresses, suits, shoes and accessories that local youngsters can access for their Prom, graduation or special occasion. There will be a small hire fee involved but I am hoping this will give them the opportunity of having an outfit that they would not normally be able to have due to financial constraints. It is also saving many clothing items being sent to landfill.

The 'wardrobe' currently has around 60 dresses, 10 suits and various pairs of shoes. We have been featured on BBC radio and are on the BBC website, HfM Radio and Radio Leicester. I have received many local donations and, due to the BBC coverage, parcels from Surrey, Co Durham, Milton Keynes and Lincoln. John Lewis are also donating a number of items to the wardrobe. An international photographer also came into school to do a professional dress shoot with some of the committee. I am hoping to get those photos within the next few days.

I have been slightly overwhelmed by the support for the initiative and by the number of enquiries I have received from youngsters interested in accessing the clothing. I think it shows there is a call for this.
