Back in November, many local primary school children took part in the Primary Mathematics Challenge at Welland Park Academy. This national competition has become a regular event at the Academy for the best year 5 and 6 mathematicians in the area. This year 63,000 children took part cross the country with 4500 making it through to the bonus round.

Emma Aslett, teacher at the Academy and Ahead 4 Numbers business owner, organises the event and works with the children prior to the actual challenge.

Four of the children, all from Kibworth Primary scored highly enough to make it through to the bonus round with one of them securing a silver award.

Emma hopes more local schools will participate next year. She thanked Welland Park Academy for hosting and funding the event.
