

POETRY LIVE

I am delighted to inform you that the English Department is organising a trip to GCSE Poetry Live! in Northampton on Tuesday 6th February 2024.

At this event students will have the opportunity to hear poets reading and discussing their work from the anthology that all students have to study. The poets will also respond to students' questions and discuss how poems connect to and influence other poems. A highly experienced Chief Examiner will deal with skills vital for GCSE success, and there will also be a session on tackling unseen poetry.

We feel this would be an excellent source of revision and altogether an invaluable experience for our Y11 students.

The total cost of the trip is £28 per pupil, which must be paid in full by 22nd January 2024. As we were only able to obtain 47 tickets for this event, they will be sold on a first come first served basis.

The Academy's preferred method of payment is via Parent Pay, our online system. If you do not have login details for Parent Pay, please contact the school office.

It is a full day and students will arrive back at the school at around 4-pm.

Welland Park Rewards – FAQs

Why have we done this?

Because the student body has asked for this. Student council and student voice has indicated that they would like to be rewarded for their efforts. We also believe in positive re-enforcement; we do things for the intrinsic value but also for external validation and reward.

2. What does it look like, the Welland Park Rewards?

Students will receive electronic or virtual achievement points for showing enthusiasm and determination, kindness, team work and many other characteristics. These will show on Edulink as:

- A1
- A2
- A3
- Principal's Award.

These numbers, A1-3, reflect the number of points they have been given. Therefore, an A3 is the best achievement a student can obtain from a teacher, outside of the Principal's Award.

How will it work?

This half term sees the launch of the new system. Students will be able to access the rewards through the number of <u>achievement</u> points they get. Rewards will be given out every half term in addition to there being end of term and end of year rewards.

Rewards will work on three levels:

Individual

Here students will be able to access the pyramid featured below. Students will need to collect a set number of achievement points in a half term in order to access the individual award. However, to achieve these rewards they must remain in gold. This means that students are not allowed to average more than 1 behaviour point a week for that half term.

Tutor Group

We are launching the Welland Park Cup. This will pit tutor groups against one another over a set period. The aim is, as a tutor group to collect the most achievement points and to avoid any behaviour points. The tutor group with the best net score (achievement points – behaviour points) at the end of the set period wins and progresses on to the next round. We keep going until there is an overall winner for the year group – they then win a prize as a tutor group.

Individual Certificates

We recognise that getting achievement points are a big thing, and they should be celebrated. Therefore, irrespective of behaviour points, students who hit milestone totals for achievement points will receive certificates in the form of Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum.

4. What will the students be able to get?

The pyramid shows the type of rewards students can access and also how each half term can contribute into the next. However, we are constantly looking to our students for inspiration and suggestions on what rewards they would like. We intend to make it a standing item for student council meetings.

Year rewards -Sift cards -Movie and pizza Half term rewards (if you achieved enough points in this half term) + - Selection boxes - Easter eggs - Ice creem Half term rewards - Non uniform day - Movie lunch times - Lunch pass

We are really hoping to see students engage with this new system. We want them to achieve these rewards for themselves but also foster a collaborative and competitive working together, as a form group as they aspire to win the interform competitions.
