- Do what they say

- Hit them



WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I SEE SOMEONE ELSE BEING BULLIED?

- Don't walk away and ignore the bullying.
- Let the bully know what is happening.
- Tell the bully to **S.T.O.P.** if it is safe to do so.
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.

- We want our school to make everyone feel safe and happy. Bullying can make people feel frightened and unhappy.

WHAT THE SCHOOL MUST DO TO HELP

Welland Park Academy uses the Anti-Bullying Alliance's definition of bullying:

- Bullying is *repetitive*—the bullying happens more than once.
- Bullying is *intentional*—the bully does it on purpose.
- Bullying is the hurting of a person or group by another person or group—there can be many bullies or just one, and there can be many people being bullied or just one.
- Bullying involves an imbalance of power—the bully (or bullies) and the victim (or victims) have different amounts of power. This can be physical strength, but it can also be another kind of power; for example, how popular they are.

Bullying can happen face to face or online.



Emotional bullying— Hurting someone mentally, e.g. isolating on purpose / teasing.

Verbal bullying— Bullying with words, e.g. name-calling, using taunts or slurs.

Physical bullying — Bullying with violent actions, e.g. hitting, pushing, tripping up.

Cyber/Online — posting on social media, sharing photos, sending nasty text messages, social exclusion

Racism— Bullying someone because of their race, their skin colour, where they come from, and so on.

Sexual Harassment — Unwanted sexual physical contact or sexual comments.

Homophobia and **Biphobia** — discrimination or bullying because of sexual orientation.

Transphobia — bullying because someone has a gender identity or expression different from their assigned sex.

Ableism — discrimination against/bullying because of a disability.

Classism — discrimination because of social class, e.g. because someone is richer or poorer. Bullying based on someone's **home structure** — e.g. because someone is in foster care.

At Welland Park Academy, we are committed to providing a caring, friendly and safe environment for all students so that they can learn in a relaxed and secure atmosphere.

- Bullying of any kind is **NOT** ok at Welland Park.
- If bullying does occur, students should be able to tell staff and know that it will be dealt with quickly and effectively.

Responsibilities of staff

- To watch for signs of distress in students, in case they are being bullied
- To **not** ignore bullying
- To take all bullying seriously
- To support the victims of bullying
- To report bullying to the Progress Leader or Form Tutor
- To follow up bullying incidents later by checking that the victim is still ok
- To promote this policy, and show it to students
