CEIAG: Coursework is explored through the various roles within theatre production; acting, costume design, lighting and sound, set design. Learners should be able to answer questions on set texts or live productions from a range of perspectives.

SMSC and British Values: Through the study of 'Blood Brothers' students engage with a captivating text and gain a deeper appreciation of the moral dilemmas, consequences of character choices and reflect on their own values. Critical thinking is encouraged to explore friendship, superstition and the impact of fate.

Enrichment: Opportunities throughout the school year to participate in Performing Arts Events - Variety Evenings, Musicals, Live Theatre Trips and Practical Workshops provided by External Practitioners to support coursework.

SMSC: Teamwork is central to all work, particularly when exploring sensitive issues as contained in 'Game Over'. Morality is discussed through 'Animal Farm' and 'Gizmo'. Cultural appreciation is encouraged through studies of Greek Theatre.

CEIAG: concepts of Archaeology are central to 'Naffytutu' and roles within theatrical work are discussed within most topics, ie. use of directors and choreography in work by Frantic Assembly (Physical Theatre and Curious Incident.

British Values: Students will be encouraged to look at empathy, respect, tolerance and democracy through scripted work.

Enrichment: Opportunities throughout the school year to participate in Performing Arts Events - Variety Evenings, Musicals.
