

Mathematics Frequently Asked Questions Page

1. How can I access MathsWatch?

Go to https://vle.mathswatch.co.uk/vle/

Students need the **first part** of their email address to log in. This will be given to them by their teacher.

2. How can I support my child at home with their Maths?

- Encourage them to practise their times tables! Times tables games - Learn them all here!
- Help them to practice their basic numeracy skills, such as multiplication, division, fractions and percentages.
- Practice using a ruler, protractor or compass. They can create some pretty patterns using a pair of compasses.
- Practice with measuring e.g. using a tape measure, weighing ingredients on a scale measuring liquids in a jug.
- Show them the electric and gas meter, or the mileage in your car!
- Encourage them to use MathsWatch to access videos.

3. My child finds a topic challenging – what can they do?

Speak to a Maths teacher at break, lunch or after school – we are happy to help!

4. My child has an assessment coming up - what can they do?

Teachers will assign a MathsWatch – ensure this is completed well in advance of the deadline so that they have chance to get assistance if they need it.

5. After an assessment, what can my child do to improve?

Your child should have completed a pink assessment feedback sheet. They can use this to signpost them to relevant videos on MathsWatch.

6. My child loves Maths and is very capable – what can they do to enrich?
