Daily Registration:

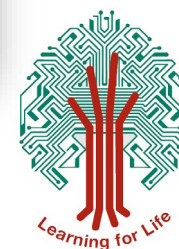

Morning Arrangements:

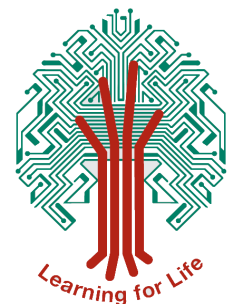
- All students should use the back gate to enter school between **8.30am and 8.40am**.

- ✓ Hair needs to be a natural colour



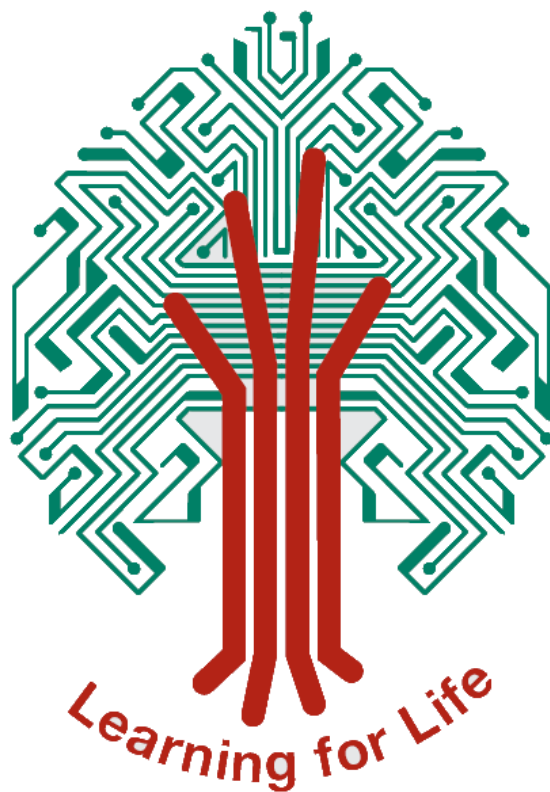

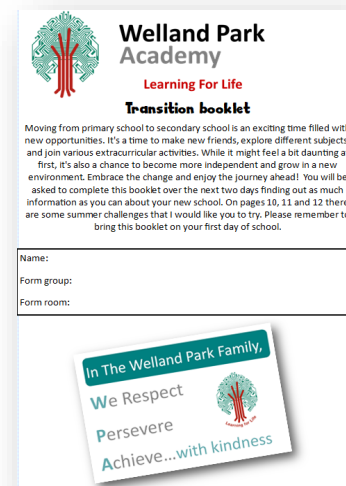
