As part of these efforts, all students now enter school through the **back gate**, which takes them through the beautiful **Welland Park**. This small change has had a big impact — not only is it a calmer, more scenic start to the day, but spending time in nature is known to reduce stress. It's also helped ease congestion on Welland Park Road, making the area safer for everyone.

Car Share

If you're driving, why not share the journey with another family? Fewer cars mean less traffic and less pollution.

Walk When You Can

If you need to drive, consider **dropping students off a short distance away**, such as at **The Commons Car Park**, so they can walk the last part through the park. Alternatively, consider cycling or scooting to school.


