- * Gold



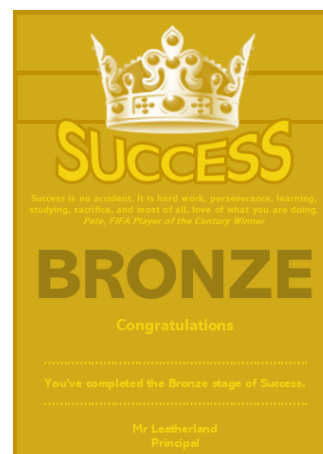
WHAT do I do?

In order to complete your Year 7 Passport, you will need to complete a range of activities linked to our **Core Values: The Welland Park Way**. The activities will be varied and can be done in school, during extra-curricular activities or outside of school. By completing the activities, you will develop the skills, qualities and experiences that are essential for now and your future.

Upon completing each step of the passport, you will be awarded a certificate matching each step, which will recognise your achievements. Each step will also have a focus on ensuring you have good attendance, behaviour and a positive attitude to learning.

Your tutor will be your main point of contact for this and they will monitor your progress and sign off activities in your passport.

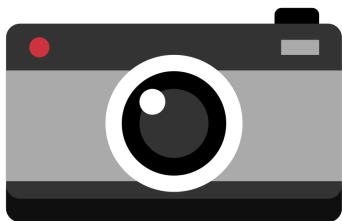




Evidencing

You will need to choose one activity per value, have a go at it, give a brief description of what you did and then provide some evidence to show you have done it.

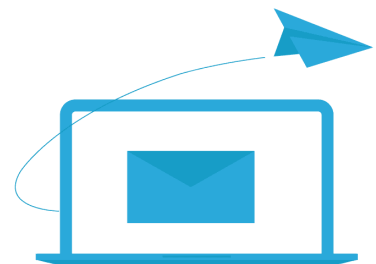
There are lots of ways for you to prove you have achieved an activity. For example:



Take a photo after the activity or get someone to take a photo of you doing it.



An evidence sticker - if you complete an activity with a teacher.



A letter/ email to your tutor from the person you completed the activity with.

You can also present other forms of evidence as appropriate to the task you choose but these will need to be verified by your tutor e.g. a certificate, achievement postcard, 100% attendance slip, award nomination slip, report, good piece of work etc.

You should try and take a copy of any item you want to use as evidence instead of using the original as you might not get it back!



Our Core Values

It is important you understand what each of the Core Values of **The Welland Way** mean. Ask a member of staff or someone in your family if you need any of the words explaining in more detail. You can even do your own research!

Value	Definition
Persevere	Perseverance is continuing to make an effort to do or achieve something, even when this is difficult or takes a long time. Runners who fall during a marathon only to pop back up and dash through the finish line show some serious <i>perseverance</i> .
Achieve	<i>Achieve</i> means to succeed in finishing something or reaching an aim, especially after a lot of work or effort, like achieving good grades, or becoming a doctor or even climbing Mount Everest!
Respect	<i>Respect</i> is a way of treating or thinking about something or someone. If you <i>respect</i> your teacher or your parents admire them and treat them well.
Kindness	Kindness is a type of behaviour marked by acts of generosity, consideration, rendering assistance, or concern for others, without expecting praise or reward in return.
